General Membership Requirements

1. Wear CATS T-shirt while completing service hours

2. If you sign up to volunteer and cannot attend, you are expected to cancel 48 hours in advance by contacting the philanthropy chair and finding a replacement

3. No shows are unacceptable and cause for probation

4. Dues are \$40 per year and can be paid with check, cash, or at paypal.me/CATSAHS

Annual Membership Requirements

All girls are required to perform 20 hours of service per year:	 15 hours must be done with CATS philanthropies No more than 5 CATS hours per year may be earned via donations
We welcome members at any time!:	• BUT required hours to earn a CATS cord remains at 80 hours total
Calendar for service: Aug.1-July 31	 All hours must be completed and logged during this time Senior hours are due by April 1st of graduating year

Earning a CATS Cord for Graduation

Be a member in good standing; Girls must complete 80 hours of service across the time they have been a CATS member

20 service hours per year (15 hours with partner philanthropies)

Up to 20 donation hours total over your four years (versus service hours) may count towards your 80 total hours

New to CATS as an upperclassman? No problem, **but you are still required to complete 80 hours by the deadline**

Hours must be completed and logged into the app prior to April 1st of your senior year.
